

## 3 inductees to join Latin Hall of Fame Sept. 9

Two former Lion gridiron stars and one of the school's most prolific basketball guards will join the Cathedral Latin Alumni Association's Athletic Hall of Fame during induction ceremonies to be held Saturday, Sept. 9 at the Notre Dame-Cathedral Latin School campus in Chardon.

This year's Cathedral Latin inductees are John Paglio '60 (deceased), Tom

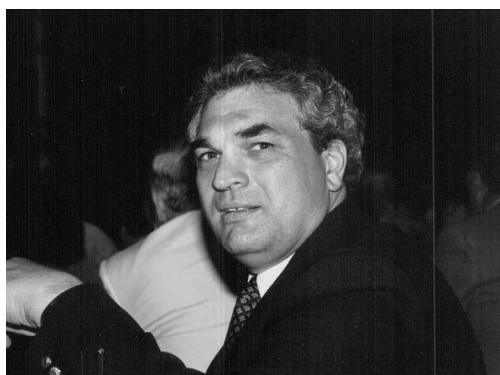
Lamb '67 and Tim Hyland '73.

They will be joined by Notre Dame Academy inductees Catherine MacDonald Quinlan '45 and Sharon Pike Walker '87, and NDCL inductees Jason Bonhard '95 and Rhonda Rickelman.

A dinner and induction ceremonies will take place at 4 p.m. under a tent near the school following the varsity

football game between NDCL and Walsh Jesuit.

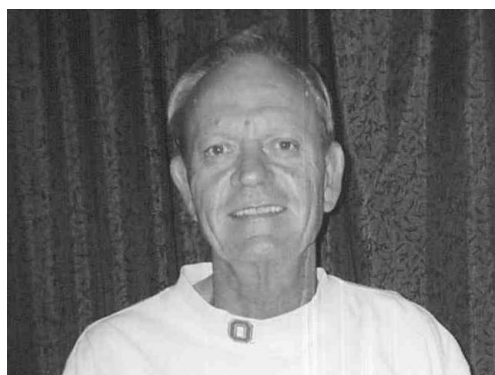


### John Paglio

An all-state honorable mention at offensive tackle and defensive end, John Paglio was a two-year stalwart in the trenches for the Lions before starring on championship teams at Syracuse University.

The 6-foot-2, 230-pound Paglio was a two-way starter as a senior. After going undefeated and winning Latin's last Charity Game appearance his junior year in 1958, Coach Fred George's team went 4-6 in the East Senate League in 1959. That year, John was named All-East Senate, All-Catholic (Universe Bulletin) and All-Scholastic (Call & Post).

### Tom Lamb

Back when the East Senate represented the toughest high school basketball competition in Ohio, guard Tom Lamb was setting scoring records for the Lions.

A two-year varsity performer and co-captain his senior season, Tom led the team in scoring and was named MVP for the 1966-67 squad, which was coached by Latin Hall of Famer Norm Baracz.

Despite a disappointing 7-12 record against the brutal East Senate competition, he was named All-East Senate, All-Catholic (Universe Bulletin), All-Scholastic (Call & Post).

### Tim Hyland

An intense, fierce-hitting linebacker and tight end, Tim was co-captain for the great 1972 football team that ranked as the top squad in the Greater Cleveland area.

A three-year letterman and two-year varsity starter, the 6-foot-1, 215-pounder earned All-Crown Conference, All-Northeastern District and All-Ohio honors for his play his senior season. The Lions, under Coach Jack Zebkar, shared the Crown Conference championship that season resulting from a tie in an epic game against co-champion St. Joseph.

I also wanted to honor and remember one of our alumni, George Werling '47 who passed away on July 21. George was a founding member and first president of the Cathedral Latin Alumni Association. He and his wife, Mary, and their family lived in Euclid for many years before moving to Rocky River. George had a successful career in the insurance industry.

George was a very dedicated trustee of our association and served on its Executive Committee. He recently served as chairman of the Athletic Hall of Fame Selection Committee and is a past chairman of the Hall of Fame Dinner Committee. He has also served on numerous other committees through the years.

George was a starter on the 1945 and 1946 Latin state championship teams, under Coaches Herb Eisele and Bill Belanich. He was one of the stars in the 1946 Charity Game victory over Holy Name that was attended by nearly 71,000 fans in the old Cleveland Stadium. He played football at Ohio University and later (again under Eisele) at John Carroll University. George was

inducted into the Latin Athletic Hall of Fame in 1999.

George's leadership, commitment and passion for Cathedral Latin School, its alumni association, and his advocacy of Notre Dame-Cathedral Latin School (NDCL) will be missed by all of us who knew and loved him. We will miss his vision, humor and friendship.

George led by example and was always willing to assist others. I am grateful for the time that I spent with him during our association as trustees. I consider George "Mr. Cathedral Latin" for his commitment and pride to his alma mater and the way he enjoyed people and

life. Thanks, George, and God bless!

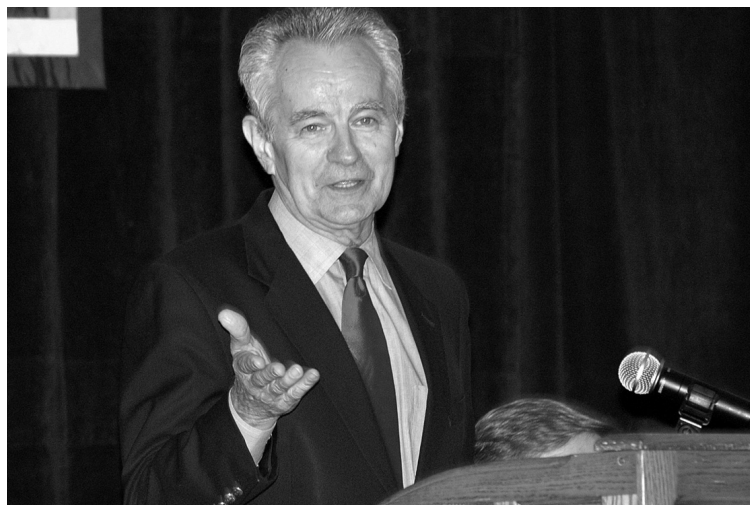

## “Our love for thee shall never cool, Cathedral Latin School”

All alumni of Cathedral Latin have sung the above-quotes lines of Latin's fight song innumerable times. And like many other alumni, George Werling lived these words until his death on July 21, 2006.

Inducted into Latin's Athletic Hall of Fame in 1999, George was an all-around athlete lettering in football, basketball and track. In 1945 and 1946 Latin won both the city and state football championships, recording nine wins and one tie in each season. George was a member of both teams.

In the 13-7 Charity Game win against St. Ignatius in 1945, he threw the winning touchdown pass to end Lenny Lapka. In the 1946 Charity Game against Holy Name, he scored a touchdown in the first quarter en route to Latin's 35-6 win.

Although honored by the accomplishments of the teams on which he played, George was equally proud that he was awarded the Bishop's Bronze Plaque for his perfect attendance during his four years at Latin.

In 1949 George and several other alumni resurrected the Latin Alumni Association that was dormant for several years. He served as its president in 1949 and again in 1956.

For the past several years, George served on various committees of the association, including the Executive Committee, Hall of Fame, Publications and Membership committees. On each, he exhibited his strong leadership and spent countless hours in meetings,



telephone conferences, and personal contacts with other alumni to “get the job done.”

In furtherance of the association's support of Notre Dame-Cathedral Latin School (NDCL) and as chairman of Latin's Hall of Fame Committee, George was a prime mover in having Latin's Hall of Fame induction ceremony and awards dinner combined with NDCL's and Notre Dame Academy's Hall of Fame inductions on the campus of NDCL. The first of these combined ceremonies was held in 2003, and proved so successful that they were repeated in 2004 and 2005. The fourth annual joint ceremony will be held Sept. 9, all of which underscores George's vision of carrying on Latin's tradition in partnership with NDCL.

For the members of the association who knew and worked with George, who relied upon his wisdom and common sense, our sense of loss cannot be fully expressed. To his wife, Mary, their eight children and 22 grandchildren, the association extends its sympathy and condolence as well as its gratitude for the countless contributions George has made to Cathedral Latin and its Alumni Association.

**'47** Rev. Kenneth Tietjen, OCSO, celebrated the golden anniversary of his ordination to the priesthood in February. He lives in the New Melleray Abbey in Peosta, Iowa. “Cathedral Latin School fostered my monastic and priestly vocations,” he said in a recent note to the alumni association.

**'69** Dominic DiMarco has been appointed executive director of strategy and chief financial officer for Ford Motor Co.'s operations in Canada, Mexico and South America. Dominic lives in Bloomfield, Mich.

**'69** Nick Restifo, a longtime teacher and football coach at St. Ignatius High School in Cleveland, has received the Ron Stoops Assistant Football coach of the Year award from the Northeast Chapter of the National Football Foundation. The award is named after Ron Stoops, who was an assistant football coach at Youngstown Cardinal Mooney High School.

John also threw the shot put for the Latin track team his junior and senior years, and played varsity basketball his senior season.

His performance on the football field earned him a scholarship to Syracuse University, where he received three varsity letters as a starting defensive lineman. He was member of the 1961 Liberty Bowl team, and in 1963 was mentioned on several pre-season All-American teams.

In 1964, John was drafted by the Baltimore Colts of the National Football League. He was the last player cut by the team when future Hall of Fame defensive end Gino Marchetti came out of retirement to play one more year. She earned her doctorate in physical therapy and works in an orthopedic clinic in Athens, Ohio.

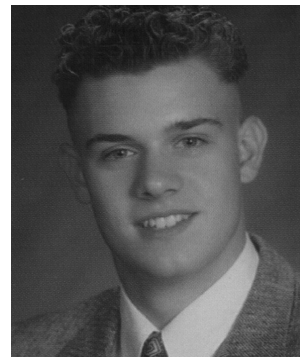


## Rhonda Rickelman
