Mass will be celebrated at 10:30 a.m. at the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist, 1007 Superior Avenue,

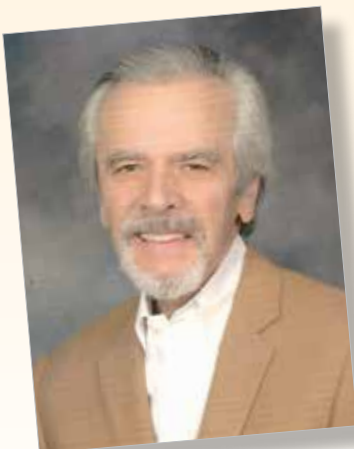

Judge Timothy E. McMonagle (retired), Class of 1963



Timothy E. McMonagle, Class of 1963, was a Judge of the Cuyahoga County Court of Common Pleas from 1983 – 1995. In 1995, he was appointed by then Governor George Voinovich to the Ohio Court of Appeals, Eighth Appellate District. While on the Court of Appeals, he served a term as Presiding and

Administrative Judge. He also sat a number of times on the Ohio Supreme Court by assignment of the Chief Justice. He served until the end of 2004 when he chose to return to the Common Pleas Court, where, in addition to his regular duties, he served as head of the Mental Health Court until his retirement in 2010.

After Latin, Tim graduated from the University of Dayton in 1967 and then returned to Cleveland John Marshall School of Law (now CSU). He became a soldier in 1969 when he was drafted out of law school and into the United States Army. He then served a tour in Vietnam with the 25th Infantry Division as a combat medic. He earned various commendations, the most important of which to him was the Combat Medics Badge. He finished his

This past year has been one of the more eventful years that I can remember for the Alumni Association. Here are some highlights of events that have occurred since our Summer Alumnotes was published:

- The annual Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony was September 24 at NDCL. Congratulations to inductees Bill Hayden '65 (deceased) and Dave Clements '73. NDCL and the Alumni have agreed to hold this event every other year, so next Hall of Fame Induction will be the Fall of 2018.
- In October, we celebrated the 100 year anniversary of the founding of Cathedral Latin School with a Centennial reunion at the W.O. Walker Building located on what used to be 107th Street (now Stokes Blvd.) on the northern edge of what was Cathedral Latin School property.
- I am happy to announce that the WWII plaque was given to a local refinisher for restoration and it looks great! It will be hung near the McGarry Gymnasium at NDCL which is located on the east side of the school. Please consider attending the dedication ceremony on Tuesday, May 9 to honor these gallant men.
- A room is secured at NDCL for Cathedral Latin Archives. The room (a former school bookstore) is 18' x 12.5' and will be set up this summer with a display window to the outside hallway. It is located on the school's second floor near much student traffic during the day.
- Contributions of \$7,963 were made to the Brother Nurthen Fund in 2016 bringing our current balance of the fund to \$163,909 — achieving our \$160,000 goal. I want

to thank everyone who made a donation to the fund which provides 8 scholarships of \$1,000 each year (2 scholarships for each grade) for descendants of Cathedral Latin Alumni who attend NDCL. Our new goal is to increase the balance to \$320,000 — allowing us to double those annual scholarships to \$2,000 each.

I would like to thank everyone who made a donation in any way to our alumni association whether for annual dues, memorial gift or Brother Nurthen Endowment Scholarship. Your donations keep the alumni office running. We wouldn't be going strong without your support. This year to date, we have already received \$35,099 from 730 donors!

Congratulations to our 2017 Man of the Year, Judge Timothy E. McMonagle (retired), Class of 1963. Tim is the recipient of the Merit Award — the highest honor from our alumni association.

enlistment and returned to law school. After the Ohio Bar Exam, he practiced both criminal and civil law. In 1980, he became a founding Board member of the Northern Ohio Vietnam Veterans. This Chapter was the very first chapter of the V.V.A. in this area.

He remained active in veterans' affairs as a judge. He has been a speaker at Veterans Day ceremonies on Cleveland Public Square, the Traveling Wall events at Cuyahoga Community College and at Mall A commemorating the end of the Vietnam War. He was also an active organizer of "Firebase Cleveland" which was the 1988 Vietnam Veterans Welcome Home Parade and festivities.

Tim has served a number of terms as the Chairman of the Common Pleas Court Veterans Committee where he was instrumental in getting Vietnam veterans appointed to the county Veterans Service Commission. Presently, he is a member of the "Old Timers" — Vietnam vets who allegedly are prominent in business and law. In this role, the "Older Timers" recently raised money to equip a home for veterans sponsored by the Lutheran Metropolitan Ministry and made possible by the Cuyahoga County Land Bank.

In retirement, Tim has served as the chair of the Cuyahoga County Debarment Commission which reviews claims of persons and companies barred from doing business with the county. He also served as the co-chair of the Task Force on Judicial Excellence sponsored by the Cleveland Metropolitan Bar Association.

Tim is married to Christine T. McMonagle, who is also a retired Common Pleas Court and Court of Appeals Judge. They have two children. Ryan is a trial attorney with the U.S. Department of Justice in Washington, D.C. Their daughter Talley is a social worker with the Western Reserve Area Agency on Aging.

Tim writes, "I am truly proud to be included in the elite group of alumni previously selected as Man of the Year, especially Judges George McMonagle '24, John Toner '33, Frank Gorman '36 and Salvatore Calandra '39. All of them friends and greatly missed. It is my great honor to be included with them. My four years at Latin taught me to appreciate the school motto 'Opere et Veritate.' Literally it means In Deed and Truth, but to me it means Act in Truth. I have strived to let that be my guide in life as citizen, husband, father, lawyer and judge. To any extent that I have achieved success, I realize it all began at Cathedral Latin School."

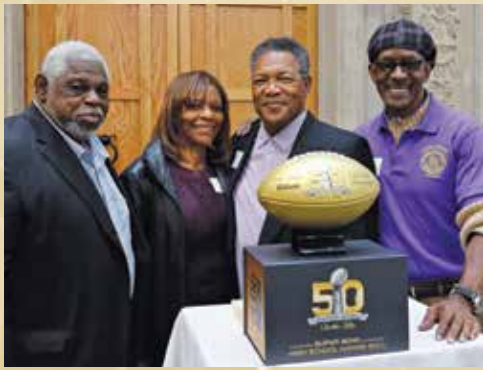

Looking Back at Early Formation at Latin

I can still remember talking with Brother Wuco, my Latin guidance counselor and math teacher, about my plan to study Civil Engineering. He insisted that I did not have the horsepower to get an engineering degree and that I had slim to no chance of graduating at all. I was surprised since my strength was mathematics. Four years later I graduated first in my class from Ohio University in Civil Engineering. I thrived in the anonymity of a large campus.



Later my college counselor felt that my plan to attend an Ivy League MBA program was ridiculous since nobody from OU had ever attended the program I was targeting. “You can’t get there from here!” Fortunately, the President of Ohio University, my main life’s mentor, was willing to sponsor me. He was a former Associate Dean of Harvard Business School. I later I received an MBA from the Tuck School at Dartmouth. Two of my

classmates who failed to complete the program at Tuck were honors graduates from Harvard and Yale.

The academic discipline I learned at Latin was the secret sauce that enabled me to have college academic success. Refusal to give up enabled what followed. I have two regrets: I should have spent more time on my studies. Academics do build your mind. It’s vastly more productive than hanging out. I also regret that I didn’t think even bigger!

Shortly after graduation from Tuck I was drafted and performed top secret computer programming research in the Pentagon. This was a five star duty assignment for my two-year hitch during Vietnam. I worked for the next five years as a management and real estate consultant in Washington, DC and New York City. I became an expert in the development of planned new communities. All HUD applications had to be accompanied by a consulting study. I had the right stuff.

Many interesting assignments followed. While I was at McKinsey, the English House of Commons asked us to assess the feasibility of developing a new community adjacent to Gatwick Airport, the replacement/partner to

aging Heathrow. At another firm, Mormon interests and New York investment bankers hired us to assess the feasibility of a planned new community west of Salt Lake City. I later became an investor in a multi- thousand acre development in St. George, Utah near a former atomic bomb test site.

My most interesting project was to develop a plan to transform the inner city of Baltimore into a tourist destination. The Inner Harbor project was a huge success and is still in operation today. This kind of effort could transform the Cleveland/Lorain lakefront but for a lack of political will.

My biggest disappointment was at McKinsey. We were hired by Sea Pines, the developer of Hilton Head Island, to review plans for a new community near Richmond, Virginia. This was to be their entre into the primary home development arena. The land was owned by Supreme Court Justice Lewis Powell. Sea Pines was largely managed by Harvard Business School graduates of 1968, the same year of many of the people on the McKinsey team and myself, although I was a Tuck graduate.

The development was not feasible. It required that all new houses built in the Richmond area for the foreseeable future be built in there for the project to break even. Using data from consulting work I had done with the National Academy of Sciences, no new community achieved much more than 5% market share, much less over 100%. This revelation led to political infighting and my termination. I heard later that the underwriter of Sea Pines’ development loans learned of the study, had all of Sea Pines’ developments analyzed and pulled their support. McKinsey gradually eliminated the real estate staff.

I now realized for the umpteenth time that my optimum role was outside of a structured environment. It was time to put that St. George cash to work. For the last 40 years or so I have owned a real estate and investment hedge fund in the greater Dallas area, more recently in Avon Lake, Ohio.

Pete Pucher '55 – 4th Hall of Fame Recognition



Pete received his fourth Hall of Fame Recognition on Sunday, September 25, 2016. He was given the Athletic Award from Holy Name High School's Athletic Hall of Fame. Pete served as head football coach and athletic director for Holy Name from 1966-1970. During these years, his teams compiled a 35-10-1 record.

In 1988, Pete was inducted into the Cathedral Latin Athletic Hall of Fame. In 2009, John Carroll University's 1959 football team was inducted into the Hall of Fame. The team posted a record of 7-0 overall and 5-0 mark in

the Presidents Athletic Conference, becoming the first undefeated football team in school history. Pete played quarterback on that team.

In 2012, the 1954 Cathedral Latin football team was inducted into the Athletic Hall of Fame. Pete was quarterback for this team which had a record of 8-1-0 and 10-0-0.

The Cathedral Latin Alumni Association also honored Pete in 2005 with the Man of the Year Award. Pete spent 18 years as a guidance counselor, teacher and coach. He began his career at Latin, teaching three years. He moved to St. John Cansius High School for two years and then taught at Holy Name High School for six years. In 1970, he was named West Senate Coach of the Year.

He took the chance that I would be there or found out some other way — I am still not sure. I was in too much shock to ask really penetrating questions.

Chris is an avid metal detector treasure hunter. After a storm in 2015 he went down to the beach when the sand gets churned up and that is when he found my ring. He would not accept any remuneration. I do believe that he was as happy as I was to return the ring to its grateful owner.

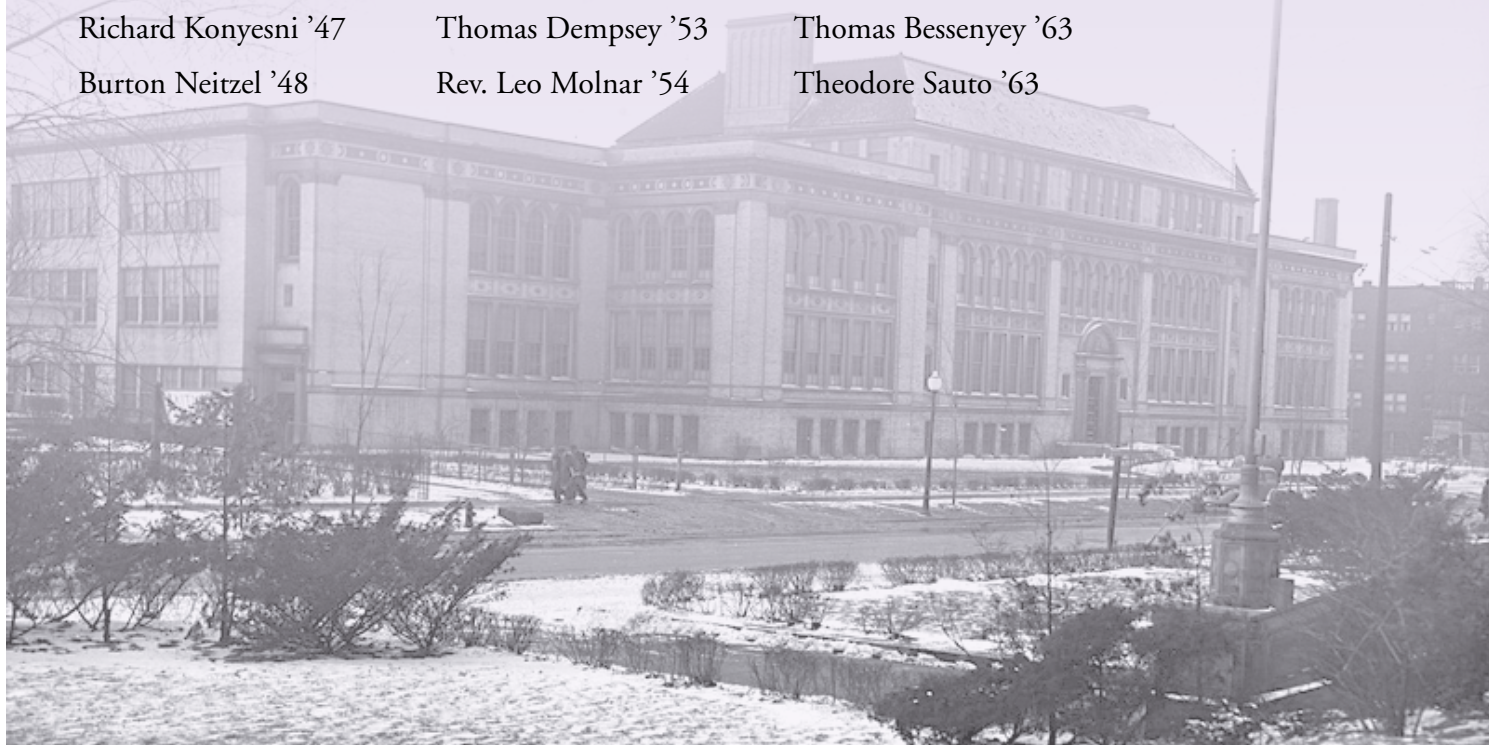

On December 7, 1941, the Japanese navy attacked the U.S. Pacific fleet anchored at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii killing 2,335 military personnel, including 1,177 on the USS *Arizona*.

A telegram arrived at 2:30 a.m. on Friday, Dec. 12, 1941 at the Halloran's home. It read in part, "*The Navy Department deeply regrets to inform you that your son Ensign William I Halloran United States Naval Reserve was lost in action in performance of his duty and in the service of his country.*"

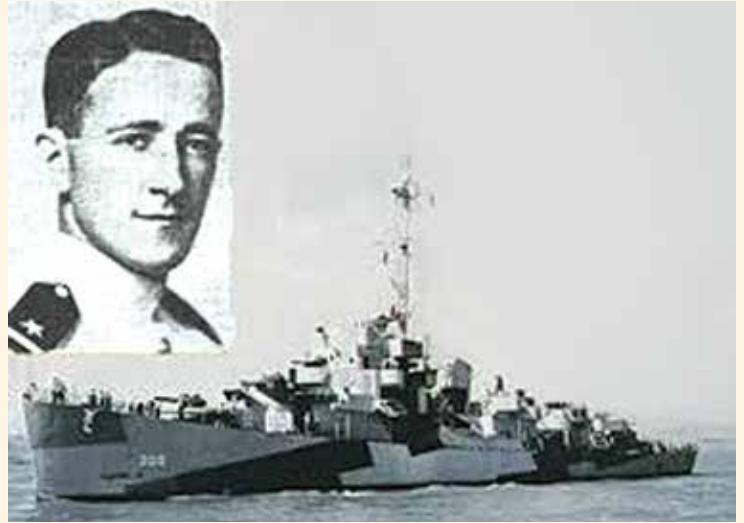
William Halloran, Class of 1933, who at age 26 became the first Ohioan, newspaperman and Knight of Columbus to die in World War II, would be remembered as a hero. Halloran was posthumously awarded the Purple Heart, American Defense Fleet Medal, Asiatic Pacific Campaign Medal and World War II Freedom Medal.

The eldest of four children, William Ignatius Halloran was born July 23, 1915, to Lawrence and Stella (née McGuire) Halloran. The family attended St. Ignatius of Antioch Church where Bill served as an altar boy. The church was a few minutes' walk from their house.

William loved exploring the woods around Cleveland, which was known as Forest City. He used to hike along the woods and bring home plants or sprouts of trees to plant. He also had a talent for art, and especially for writing, which he eventually turned into a career. In his senior year at Latin he was editor-in-chief of *The Latineer*.

Throughout high school, William woke up early to deliver the *Shopping News* before school, and he later worked as a reporter and editor for the delivery boys' newspaper, *Shopping News Jr.*

After graduating from Cathedral Latin in 1933, William attended John Carroll University for two years. Desiring a more rigorous journalism program, William decided to complete a degree in journalism at The Ohio State University. He served on the editorial staff of *The Lantern*, the Buckeye school newspaper, and was also president of the university's Interracial Council.



Upon graduating from OSU with a journalism degree in 1938, William accepted a position with United Press in Columbus, where he was an active member of the Catholic Youth Organization. In 1940, he advanced to the Cleveland bureau as sports editor.

At the invitation of his uncle, John Stock, William also joined the Knights of Columbus, becoming a member of Cleveland's West Park Council 2790.

As war broke out in Europe and the Axis powers advanced, William volunteered for active duty in the Naval Reserves on Aug. 14, 1940. On the next day, he wrote a letter to his boss explaining his decision and requesting a leave of absence from United Press.

After attending the Naval Reserve Midshipmen's School at Northwestern University, William received his commission as ensign June 12, 1941. He left Cleveland and reported on board the battleship USS *Arizona* at Long Beach, California on June 30. While stationed at Pearl Harbor, Ensign Halloran penned numerous letters to friends and family.

A solemn requiem Mass was celebrated for Ensign Halloran on Wednesday, Dec. 17, at St. Ignatius Church. More than 1,100 people attended.

Stella, Cleveland's first gold star mother of the war, soon became a speaker on Cleveland's Public Square in support of the war effort.

In 1943, shortly after posthumously awarding William the Purple Heart in May, the Navy Department announced a destroyer escort was to be named in his honor. The USS *Halloran* was christened by Stella Halloran at Mare Island, California, on January 14, 1944.

In 1945, the City of Cleveland began work on Halloran Park located in William's old neighborhood. This was its

first memorial to a WWII hero. The park was rededicated in 2000 following renovation. In 1963, Halloran House, a dormitory for engineers at Ohio State, was named in William's honor.

In 1991, on the 50th anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor, William's family visited the USS *Arizona* Memorial, where their brother was still entombed on the battleship with nearly 1,000 fellow servicemen.

WWII Plaque to be Installed at NDCL

The wait is over....The WWII plaque which once hung in the main hallway of Cathedral Latin School near the chapel will be installed near the McGarry Gymnasium in the hallway leading to the fitness room at NDCL on Friday, March 17.

Paragon Metal Refinishing, located in Euclid, Ohio was contacted to do the restoration. They cleaned, polished and resealed the plaque. That refinishing effort was completed on February 19.

The gallant men of Cathedral Latin who once trod the same hallways, studied in the same classrooms and prayed in the same chapel will be honored for sacrificing their lives in defense of the freedoms we now enjoy. We thank them for serving our country and making this supreme sacrifice.

Entrance Archway Preserved at Walker Center

As we recall in sadness, Cathedral Latin School was closed in 1979 and torn down in 1981. All that remains of its former site is its great entryway arch, which became part of the William O. Walker Center. For years the arch stood alone, with no plaque to announce its significance or to honor the greatest school Cleveland has ever seen. When the Cathedral Latin Alumni Association took on the project to purchase and install a bronze plaque honoring the legacy of our school, it took the better part of ten years to get it installed in the lobby due to a few obstacles.

The first and greatest of these obstacles was that the ownership of the Walker building advised the alumni association that it could not use the word **Catholic** on our plaque. This was difficult to understand because Latin graduated thousands of Catholic men, hundreds of priests and brothers, over a dozen bishops and two cardinals of the Church. It could have been political correctness, but this was not known.

Tom Ashdown '62 was in charge of the project initially. He kept his eye on the ball and he stuck to the truth of the matter. He argued what was right, and by perseverance, he got the wording approved. The project was set aside for a few years while the alumni association concentrated its resources on NDCL. When we restarted the project, we found this beautiful sandstone arch had under it an old plywood wall. It was blond in color, bland in nature and falling apart. On this plywood wall was a plaque honoring William O. Walker, who had no real connection to Cathedral Latin.

William O. Walker owned a newspaper, the *Call & Post*, on the adjoining city block of our school. He founded it in 1916 — the same year Cathedral Latin was founded. Walker was a giant in Cleveland, giving voice to a community that needed to have its story told. As the black community came of political age, he was instrumental in electing the men honored on the other side of the block — Lou and Carl Stokes.

Nailing his plaque to the inside of our arch was a slight to both Walker and Cathedral Latin. It was right that someone provide Walker a more fitting tribute, so we worked with the *Call & Post* to find a suitable portrait. We bought it, framed it, and set it in honor with his plaque on the east wall of the W.O. Walker building atrium. We honored the truth and did what was right.

We still had an ugly wall to contend with, so we discussed removing it or papering over it. Our favorite artist, Jim

Ptacek '60, met with us to discuss vinyl wall coverings, inserts and colors. One suggestion was to install a large vinyl photograph with a view down Latin's main hallway, showing the trophy cases on either wall. We prepared a presentation, but the Walker building committee rejected it without reason. So we prepared another presentation covering the plywood, but once again it was rejected. Two other presentations followed and met the same fate.

Ptacek then suggested installing replica doors inside the arch. Everyone remembered the school doors, but we had no photographs. Our administrator, Sue Wise, scoured yearbooks, but could not come up with a good picture. Finally, Jim Feldkircher '52 found an old grainy photograph, taken from an angle and at quite a distance. We needed a graphics program to turn it back into a rectangle and colorize it for yet another presentation.

When our current alumni president Joe Nista '64 heard that wooden doors were being considered, he offered to build them. After taking wall measurements, the mocked-up photograph was studied and sketches for the doors were drawn.

In 2014, Jeff Groves, took over as building manager at the Walker Center and everything changed for the better. Our door design was approved, Nista built the doors and they were installed just before Christmas. The plaque, honoring the legacy of our school, was also installed. Not only was the word **Catholic** prominent in the wording, but the words **Society of Mary** were set in bold type too. With our plaque and arch and the west wall gracing this atrium, the Walker Center added some pretty nice art work, and what was just a lobby has become a venue.

Fidelity and perseverance — that's what it took to make everything happen. With a scant \$4,000, we struck a blow for the free exercise of religion, honored a local hero and fought for the right.

Isn't that the Cathedral Latin experience? Living **in deed and in truth**, with God's help, we transformed a small space, just as we transformed the City of Cleveland, NDCL, and so many places in this community, in this nation, and around the world.

For 100 years, Men of Latin have lived the faith boldly. Nothing has deterred us from the ideals the Marianists taught us. Keep the faith and persevere in all you do. God will bless us all and transform all the places we build and call home.

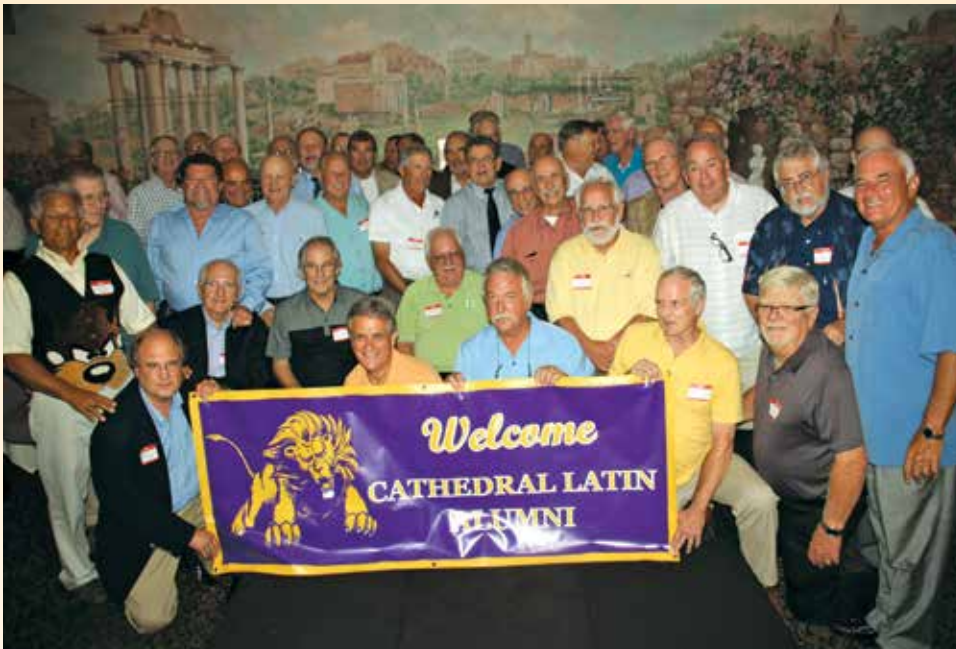

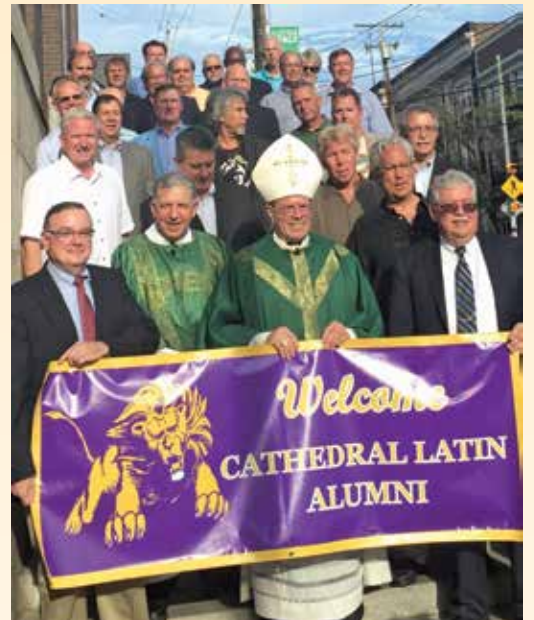
