

LET'S BE FRANK...

Bro. Frank Nurthen Scholarship Fundraiser

The Trustees of the Cathedral Latin Association have approved the largest and last major fundraiser of the Association's 69-year history. This campaign hopes to raise \$500,000 for the Brother Frank Nurthen Endowed Scholarship Fund. The fund currently stands at \$178,000 and we want to increase that amount with a new goal of \$678,000.

We all knew and loved Brother Frank. This scholarship fund honors and preserves the memory of a man who epitomizes the spirit of the Marianist Order and Cathedral Latin School. Brother Frank unselfishly devoted his entire life to making young students realize their potential and took a personal interest in the thousands of young men he helped who walked the halls on E. 107th Street. In addition to an educator, advisor and administrator at Cathedral Latin, he also served 30 years as moderator for the Alumni Association.

This fund was established by our association in 1989 to provide scholarships to students who are direct descendants of Cathedral Latin alums. At that time, tuition was \$1,950/year — now students are paying \$12,795. To date we have provided scholarships to 53 deserving students. We currently provide two students

per class \$1,000 scholarships and would like to increase the award to \$4,000 per student to help offset the cost of tuition.

We are asking for a one-time gift or pledge (maximum of 3 years). Please consider a donation to this fund to carry on Brother Frank's spirit and leave our legacy at NDCL. Your gift ensures our future alumni students will benefit from your kindness and receive the gift of a Catholic education.

This year, our alumni association continues to support NDCL. We have made various donations including:

Tony Severino '66 to Retire as Football Coach

Rockhurst football coach Tony Severino, who will be inducted into the Missouri Sports Hall of Fame later this month, has won seven high school state championships with the Hawklets.

In December, he will leave his dream job as the best to ever hold it. Severino, the winningest football coach in Kansas City high school history, informed his team Tuesday that the 2019 season will be his last. He's been at this for half a century, the past 37 years at Rockhurst.

Severino, a member of five different Halls of Fame, has been progressing toward retirement for nearly a decade now, his colleagues joking that they thought he would never retire.

The Hawklets have compiled a 338-88-1 record during his nearly four decades at the helm. They made the title game 11 times, including last season. He previously won a football state title at Shawnee Mission Northwest and a baseball state championship at Shawnee Mission West.

Severino said, "I learned a long time ago from an old coach that you need to celebrate the good ones and not always dwell on your losses, because as coaches we have a tendency to think so much about the losses and what could have been. It made a lot of sense."



Severino turned down four college job offers to stay at Rockhurst. He wanted to coach his three sons, who all graduated from Rockhurst.

We wish Tony all the best with his retirement.

Jerel Erne graduated from Latin in 1969. When he graduated Latin, he joined the Army and worked as a medic. He did so well that the army had him finish college and later sent him to medical school to become a doctor. He served for over 32 years including Desert Storm and retired as Lt. Colonel. He continued to service the soldiers at Fort Gordon. Jerel passed away from cancer on October 9, 2010.





Bishop Neal Buckon '71 – Serving God and Country

Playing a key role in the defense of the country and countless other military operations throughout history were military chaplains, including Catholic priests who ministered to the soldiers, sailors and airmen. The Diocese of Cleveland has a long legacy of support for the military chaplaincy, with dozens of priests serving since 1880.

Currently, the diocese is represented by Archbishop Timothy Broglio, who heads the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA; Bishop Neal Buckon, an auxiliary bishop for the archdiocese; and Fathers Joe Brankatelli and Curt Kondik, Army chaplains on active duty at Fort Riley, Kansas. Perhaps the longest-serving military chaplain from the diocese is Father Joe Piskura, who spent nearly 40 years with the Army, including 27 years on active duty.

Father Joe crossed paths with Bishop Buckon at St. Margaret Mary Parish in Cleveland Heights. The bishop is a 1975 graduate of John Carroll University. He served in the ROTC program at JCU and was recognized as a Distinguished Military Graduate. He went on active duty after graduation and is a much-decorated Army veteran, serving in both the infantry and transportation branches.

"I was thinking about the priesthood while I was on active duty," he said. After resigning his commission, he became the first co-sponsored seminarian, which meant he entered the seminary in Cleveland, served one assignment at a parish and then was "loaned" to the archdiocese for assignment as a military chaplain.

Buckon joined the Army Reserves in 1990, while a seminarian. In 1998, he was back on active duty, as a chaplain this time, and he agreed to serve until retirement, which was Dec. 31, 2010.

"I was on a trip to the Holy Land when I got a call saying that the Holy Father wanted me to serve as an auxiliary bishop for the archdiocese," he said. "I found out on Dec. 8. The Gospel story was Mary's fiat — saying 'yes' to God. I wrote Pope Benedict a letter saying that I would serve."



Bishop Buckon was ordained a priest in 1995 and was elevated to bishop on Feb. 22, 2011, and serves as Archbishop Broglio's vicar for the Western Region, overseeing Catholic pastoral care at 95 military installations for all branches of the service in 18 states. He goes to bases, hospitals and military prisons to visit his flock.

As a chaplain, Buckon said many people — not just Catholics — come to his office. Some are suffering from invisible wounds. He tries to help them get back their balance in life.

"We meet the spiritual needs of those serving our country. Some are thinking about suicide, some are having marital difficulties or other problems. It can be pretty intense. But they hear the words of Christ. Where else could they go and hear those words? We're there for everybody. We recognize that everyone has a soul and spirit and we try to keep them and their families strong. They carry a heavy burden," he said.


"In the end, it's good for me to be here. I may have been able to save a life," Bishop Buckon added. He quoted Gen. Maxwell Taylor from WWII by saying that the spirit of a soldier is everything. Larry Kaminski '62 Chosen to Top-100 Team

The Broncos' Top-100 team includes 47 offensive players, 46 defensive players, and seven special-teams players. This Top-100 Team is one of three Broncos' groups to be formally recognized by the franchise.

Brother Steven Grazulis, SM – *Celebrates 50 years*

Brother Grazulis was born and raised in Painesville, Ohio, where he attended State Street (elementary) School, Walnut Junior High School and Harvey High School. He professed first vows on Aug. 22, 1968, in Marcy, New York. He attended University of Dayton in Dayton, Ohio, where he earned a bachelor's degree in psychology in 1973. He later earned a master's degree in counseling psychology at United States International University in Nairobi, Kenya, in 1991.

In his early ministry as a Marianist, Brother Grazulis served at high schools in Ohio for nine years. From 1973-1979, he was teacher, assistant athletic director and head cross country coach at Cathedral Latin School in Cleveland and teacher, head cross country coach and assistant track coach at Archbishop Moeller High School in Cincinnati for three years (1979-1982).

His service took on both a new focus as well as a new continent — Africa — in 1982 when he began what has become a 35-plus-year formation ministry for the Society of Mary. Bro. Grazulis initially served in Ekpoma, Nigeria, as a formator for the Marianist novitiate, followed by more than 25 years of formation work in Nairobi, Kenya. His formation



work in Kenya, which spanned from 1985 to 2011, included a wide age group, from aspirancy to scholasticate and novitiate, and from college to seminary. His roles during that time in Nairobi included formator, novice director, lecturer at Apostles of Jesus Seminary and college instructor at Marist International Centre and Tangaza College. In 2011, Bro. Grazulis began serving at the Faustino Formation Community where he resides and serves, primarily, in the formation of aspirants. He celebrated his 50th jubilee on Saturday, Aug. 11, 2018 in Dayton, Ohio.

Brother Mike O'Grady, SM '64 – Serving the Marianist Community

Mike O'Grady decided to become a Marianist in 1961 as a freshman at Cathedral Latin School. He was impressed by the Marianist brothers and priests who were his teachers. He said it was the best decision he ever made.

After his freshman year, Mike entered the Marianist postulate to begin religious formation while continuing his studies. He graduated in 1964 and a year later professed first vows as a Marianist brother. He attended the University of Dayton and then began a career which included teaching high school and guiding young men in Marianist formation. He served St. Aloysius for more than 20 years as director of religious education and later pastoral administrator.

Brother Mike says he's had it so good. Each assignment, each place has been rich and rewarding. He's never had a bad job. In 2012 he was called to serve as director of the Marianist Residence Community in San Antonio, Texas. The residence is located on the campus of St. Mary's University and is a community for approximately 40 aging Marianists — many who need nursing care.

Mike considers it a privilege to take on this role and provide personal one-on-one ministry to Marianist brothers and priests confronting challenges of old age. He takes the time to listen and makes the time to take a brother to a ballgame or movie. He says he's there to serve and it brings him joy and gives his life meaning.

Brother Mike has been quoted to be quick to laugh, quick to joke and quick to make you feel like he's been your friend forever. He says he "lives in gratitude" and is doing what he wants to do and God has guided him. He found purpose in

In 1945-1946, my Latin classmate Raymond Burns and I were in the 8th grade at St. Columbkille School at E. 26th Street and Superior Avenue in Cleveland, Ohio. It was a very small school with only four classrooms. There were only seven boys in our graduation class.

We read that Cathedral Latin and St. Ignatius were to play football for the City Championship in the 1945 Charity Game. We had never seen either school and knew nothing about them — not even where they were located.

Nonetheless, we decided to attend the game and to apply to the winning school. Latin came from behind to beat St. Ignatius 13 to 7. So true to our promise, Ray and I enrolled at Latin and graduated in 1950.


