Hall of Fame to Honor Jim Baron Class of 1971 Friday, September 23



Jim Baron '71

"In spite of the team's poor record, the performance of at least one of the Latin players impressed the locals enough to earn some postseason honors. Offensive guard Jim Baron was named to the All-Scholastic team." (from When the Lions Roared, page 221).

Jim's All Scholastic football honors take on added meaning when you consider he is the only member of the class of 1971 to be named all scholastic in any sport. And what an accomplishment when you consider who some of his fellow all scholastics are (e.g., Pete Cusick, Ohio State first team All American and Eric Penick, starting halfback on Notre Dame's 1973 National Championship team).

Jim was a devastatingly effective blocker at Latin, adept at both interior man-on-man and outside sweep assignments. He was a 2-year starter on the offensive line, earning varsity letters his junior (1969) and senior



(1970) year. Jim's senior year vs. St. Edward found him consistently up against Ed Trepanier (6'5", 255 lbs.), the Eagles strongman and All Scholastic defensive lineman. (Trepanier went on to play on the defensive line for Ohio

State.) Jim played a great game, being one of the major reasons for Latin's thrilling come from behind victory over Ed's and the fact that Lions out rushed the Eagles 146 vs. 77 yards.

Jim was a big part of the 1970 senior season offensive success, a year when the team scored 120 points, almost doubling the previous year total of 66 points.

In addition to All Scholastic honors, Jim was also named 1970 First Team All Crown Conference by a vote of the league's head coaches. Jim's play was a major factor in Latin achieving a second-place finish in the tough Crown Conference.

In addition to his four years of football, Jim ran track freshman and sophomore years. He was class homeroom officer his freshman and sophomore years, sophomore class Vice President and senior class President. His senior year, he was a member of the Latineer staff.

During freshman year, Jim was forever nicknamed "Nino" by classmate Bill Annandono '71 due to his likeness to Nino Benvenuti, the then reigning World Middleweight Boxing Champion from Italy. And as a finale to Jim's Latin athletic versatility, he stepped up to be on the card for Latin's 2nd annual Lion Bouts Boxing event held in the hastily constructed ring in the middle of the school gymnasium. Jim battled classmate John M. Murphy '71 to a standstill.

Jim Baron (#66) executes a perfect downfield block his junior year vs. St. Ignatius on September 13. 1969. Jim's athletic career did not end when he graduated from Latin in 1971.

His hard work was rewarded when he became the only member of his class receiving a full Division I NCAA athletic scholarship. He accepted that offer from Illinois State University, attending there and starting at offensive guard on their 1971 freshman football team.

Jim transferred to Ohio Wesleyan University his sophomore year where he continued to play football. Because of his transfer, he was prohibited from varsity game play in the fall of 1972 (but could be on the team, which he chose to do).

Jim went on to play college football his junior (fall 1973) and senior (fall 1974) years as a 2-year starting offensive guard. He graduated in 1975 with a degree in sociology.

He grew up in Mayfield Heights, OH with loving parents and four brothers and sisters. In 1984 he married Nancy Walker and helped raise two daughters, Meredith Baron Miller of Columbus, OH and Kelsey Baron, MD of Salt Lake City, UT.

In 2021 Jim semi-retired from Baron Photography and The Image Finders business that he started in 1985. He currently resides in Mentor, OH and enjoys biking, hiking and traveling. He also enjoys golf and socializing with a number of his classmates.

Good Things Coming Up This Year



Before I get into what's going on this year, I want to thank all the Trustees for allowing me to continue as President of the Alumni Association for another two years. Covid put a real damper in 2020 and 2021 on our efforts to drive the Brother Nurthen Endowed Scholarship fund balance up to \$500,000 from what had been a \$175,000 balance. Despite the difficulties we had in meeting with potential donors, we were able to get that balance up to nearly \$300,000 and to increase our scholarship amounts from eight \$1,000 scholarships to eight \$1,750 scholarships. We continue to drive toward that \$500,000 fund balance target. If you are interested in making a donation, please contact Sue at the alumni office.

Our dues collections remain strong and we've actually had an increase in the number of dues paying alumni over the past three years - from 2018 to 2021. We thank you all for your support. Your donations allow us to keep operating our office, to promote our own camaraderie and to continue to support our legacy school Notre Dame-Cathedral Latin (NDCL).

Finally, I want to reaffirm our thanks to Sue Wise for continuing to do such a great job of running our office and coordinating all the events that we hold each year. We cannot operate without her.





John M. Kennedy '78 Receives 2021 Cal State LA President's Distinguished Professor Award

Cal State LA recognized John M. Kennedy for his excellence in teaching and outstanding achievements during the University Convocation 2021.



Kennedy, a professor of music composition in the university's Department of Music, was presented a 2021 Cal State LA President's Distinguished Professor Award during the August 19 event. This award, which goes to a previous outstanding professor recipient, acknowledges the faculty member's superlative teaching and exceptional commitment to students, as well as professional accomplishments and services.

Kennedy's creative activity and scholarship have an international focus and include a U.S. Fulbright Scholar Award to the University of Malta and performances of original compositions in 15 countries on four continents. His work has been recognized with annual awards from the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers since 1991, along with commissions from soloists and ensembles worldwide. He continues to explore styles and sounds through improvisation projects on the double bass.

At Cal State LA, he has been active in cross-campus initiatives, including the Ford Foundation's Crossing Borders project and the Smithsonian's American Sabor exhibition. His work to enhance the music composition program has included regular collaborations with the L.A. Philharmonic and guest ensembles from the U.S. and Europe. He also developed and implemented a cross-disciplinary music minor program, Creative Studies in Music. He is a current fellow of the American Communities Program at Cal State LA.

His scholarship is focused on the convergence of musical styles in the late 20th and early 21st centuries, and he is active in advocating for reform of the undergraduate music curriculum nationwide. He and his

wife, guitarist Satik Andriassian, have presented joint research and performances in China, Malta, the United Kingdom and Italy. In 2013, he received Cal State LA's Outstanding Professor Award.

A Woodland Hills resident,
Kennedy attended the Berklee
College of Music and Baldwin
Wallace Conservatory, completing
undergraduate studies in double
bass. He received a fellowship in
composition to attend the
University of Michigan, where he
completed the M.M. and A.Mus.D.
While attending Michigan, he was
awarded the prestigious Charles
Ives Scholarship from the American
Academy of Arts and Letters in
New York.



Reigning Back Pocket 9-Ball World Champion Mike Gulyassy, Class of 1972



Mike started playing pool in 1968, when he was 14 years old with some friends. As time went on Mike continued to play and practice every day. In order to sharpen his skills, Mike ventured out to other pool halls and was up for a challenge with anyone who would be willing to play against him. With the proper guidance and his zest for the game, Mike became one of the best players in Ohio and started to progress his play by moving around the country. Eventually, Mike became one of the best players in the world.

One of Mike's most memorable moments was winning the Title of BCA 8-ball Amateur Champion in 1982. A couple of years later, Mike added a 2nd place finish in the River City open followed by a 3rd place finish in the Last Call for 9 Ball in Atlantic City. In 1985 Mike earned the title of 12th place US ranking in the world of billiards. Taking his 12th place standing Mike added to his growing list of tournaments, by finishing high in the World Championships in Taipei in 1996.

Mike also played on the Mosconi Cup team two years in a row in 1995 and 1996. A special note to the 1996 event...Mike was the only player to defeat Oliver Ortman in the singles event. This turned out to be the only defeat Ortman would face during the event.

In an event sanctioned by the men's Professional Tour in 1995, Mike became the reigning Back Pocket 9-Ball World Champion.

In the late 90s, the last tournament that Mike was able to play in was an event sanctioned by the Camel Tour. Mike's back was becoming increasingly crippling to his game and was becoming increasingly difficult to manage. During this last event, Mike defeated Jimmy Reid, Alan Hopkins, Nick Varner, Eferin Reves and Dallas West in one day and was thinking this might be a good time for him retire. The following day, Mike took his final defeat at the hands of Johnny Archer and laid his professional pool playing days to rest.

Today, Mike is busy making some of the finest playing instruments in the game of pool. Mike also owns the patent on the Ferrule tip and is the original designer of the Sledgehammer Jump Break Cue!

Mike is also an expert instructor and can offer a full range of lessons for the beginner to the top level of professional player.





Crain's 2021 Notable Entrepreneur Award Given to Don Scipione '61

With a doctorate in physics and a stint as a machinist on his resume, Don Scipione yokes vision with hands-on expertise and has served as a teacher and mentor.



Scipione heads a company commercializing a technology for solar panels, an idea he credits to Rob Martens, president of BT Solar, a co-tenant in the Midtown Cleveland headquarters of Acme Express, Scipione's technology development concern that does business as Roll-A-Rack.

For example, at Roll-A-Rack, which forms racks on-site to install solar panels, he garnered research funding under the U.S. Small Business Innovation Research, worked with MAGNET and other local nonprofits to refine it, and linked up with Mazzella Cos. of Cleveland to make it. Other products are connected to business use of the internet, including software for physician scheduling, truck routing and even teaching arithmetic.

Scipione is civically engaged on a grand scale. He has served as

chairman of the MidTown Cleveland local development corporation, was involved in Cuyahoga County's charter reform movement, and has or has had board roles at several local opera companies.

He also judges the Intel/Regeneron International Science Fair and the Northeast Ohio Science and Engineering Fair. He won the latter in 1960.

John Day, Class of 1959

By his brothers, Ralph Day (CLS 1959) and Bill Day (CLS 1961)

John Day graduated in 1959 from Cathedral Latin School. He was 5'8" tall and weighed 125 pounds when he entered high school as a freshman in 1955. He was told he was too small to play football, but he played on the undefeated championship team. After graduation, he attended Ohio University where once again he was told he was too small to play hockey but ended up playing varsity hockey.

In 1965, John enlisted in the U.S. Army and volunteered for Vietnam as he thought it was his duty. He became a First Lieutenant after graduation from Officers' Candidate School. He saw action and was awarded a Silver Star for gallantry, a Bronze Star and three Purple Hearts.

John passed away on June 9, 2022 and was laid to rest with full honors at Florida National Cemetery on July 11 Lake Worth, Florida. He was 81 years old.



He lived a full life and is survived by his wife, Hedy, of 53 years of Coconut Creek, FL and daughter Kim Day MacDonald of Boca Raton.

He was never too small.

In Remembrance – A Past President of Cathedral Latin A Story about Fr. James McKay, SM

I've always wanted to write a story about Fr. McKay – not just because he was President and Principal of Cathedral Latin while I was there, but because he let me off the hook the only time I was ever late getting into my homeroom at the

start of one school day. During my senior year I had picked up my buddy Steve on the way to school and we had parked in the lot behind Latin. We were early, so we decided to study in the car for a test we were having that day. We really got into it and lost track of time. Suddenly we heard the bell - YIKES, we had just a few minutes to get to our homerooms. I ran, but couldn't get there on time. My homeroom teacher (a Marianist not to be named here) sent me to see Father McKay in the office. I had made it almost all the way through four years at Latin never missing a day and never late. But here I was in the last half of my senior year - going to the office because I was studying for a test in my car and lost track of time. After listening to my story, Father Jim told me not to worry about it and to return to my homeroom. He let me off the hook!

Jim McKay was only 14 years old when he entered the postulate at Mount St. John in Dayton Ohio. He began his novitiate there in 1933 and professed his first vows in August 1934. In 1937, he earned his bachelor's degree in education from the University of Dayton and began teaching at Cathedral Latin. He professed perpetual vows in August 1938. Jim remained at Latin until 1941 when he began studies at St. Meinrad Seminary in Southern Indiana (WWII prevented him from attending the Marianist Seminary in Fribourg, Switzerland which would have been customary). In 1944, Jim was ordained a priest in Dayton and taught at Purcell High School in

Cincinnati for three years. During the summers, he worked to earn a master's degree in classical languages at Western Reserve University in Cleveland, Ohio. He then moved to Ponce, Puerto Rico teaching religion, English and German. In the mid-1950s he attended The Ohio State University continuing his study of classical languages and serving as chaplain at St. Joseph Academy in Columbus, Ohio.

In 1958, Father Jim returned to Cathedral Latin School spending the next six years as President and Principal. It was a time of great growth for Latin as the student population grew to more than 1,200 at the start of the 1963-1964 school year. After the 1964 school year, he left Latin and became chaplain at Chaminade High School in Dayton for a year. He then went to teach at Covington Catholic in Covington, Kentucky (1965-1966) and then to North Catholic in Pittsburgh (1966-1969). Following his assignment at North Catholic, he ministered at the Bergamo Retreat Center in Dayton until 1972, spent two years as principal at Mater Dei High School in Evansville, Indiana and then, in late 1974 became director of the Bergamo East Conference Center in Marci, New York for two years.

Following his assignment in Marci, Father Jim began a new role as a parish priest at Emmanuel Church in Dayton, Ohio where he remained for 12 years. In 1988, Father Jim moved to the Marianist Community at Johnstone Place in Cincinnati, Ohio providing pastoral services for the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. Following that assignment, in 1990, Father Jim served ministries in Dublin, Ireland and at North Catholic High School in Pittsburgh - finally retiring to live in Dayton, Ohio at the Alumni Hall and the Siena Woods communities.

Father Jim passed away in Dayton, Ohio in 2015 after 80 years of profession and 70 years as a priest. Notre Dame-Cathedral Latin School maintains an endowed scholarship in Father Jim's name to which contributions can be made by contacting Keven Krajnak at keven. krajnak@ndcl.org.

A Tribute to Pete Pucher, Class of 1955 (1937 – 2021)

Pete contributed to the community as an educator, guidance counselor, coach and athletic director for many high school students in the Cleveland area. He also was involved with the development programs at John Carroll University and Notre Dame-Cathedral Latin School.

Pete was starting quarterback and co-captain of the 1954 Cathedral Latin City Championship football team. He was inducted into the Athletic Hall of Fame in 1988. He also ran track, played basketball, treasurer of his class, a National Honor Society member and president of the Sodality. He stated that Latin gave him direction.

He graduated from John Carroll University in 1960, leading the football team to an undefeated season in 1959. The team was named to the JCU Athletic Hall of Fame in 2009.

Following graduation from John Carroll, Pucher worked as an educator and football coach, where he achieved success at several high schools in Cleveland, Ohio and Detroit, Michigan, including Cathedral Latin, St. John Cansius, Holy Name in Ohio and Austin Catholic Prep in Detroit. He was inducted into the Holy Name Hall of Fame and received the Greater Cleveland Football Coaches Association Golden Deeds Award in 1991.



Pete remained close to his classmates because they shared a brotherhood while at Latin. He said the Marianists Brothers helped build a great devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary and that stuck with him and his classmates.

In 2005 Pete was named Cathedral Latin's Man of the Year. This award is given to an alum that has distinguished himself in his chosen field of endeavor in a manner that brings renown to CLS.

Sadly, Pete passed away on January 3, 2021 at the age of 83. He was truly a Man of Latin and served "In Deed and Truth." He is survived by his wife, Terrie, and daughters Jeanne and Julie.

A Special Lion to Remember Dominic LoGalbo '50

Dominic made his life as a private business owner and real estate investor. However, his passion was giving his time and talent to the communities he loved. He dedicated over 70 years of service to the Cathedral Latin Alumni Association. He and four others started the alumni association. He served as President of the alumni association from 1959-1960. In 1980, he was honored as Man of the Year.
