



Giardino/Nista Men of the Year 2026 Men of the Year to be honored at Communion Breakfast - Sunday, April 26

Former Cathedral Latin Alumni Association President, and current Trustee Joe Nista '64 has been selected as the CLAA Man of the Year for 2026. Joe shares the Merit Award this year with Brother Tom Giardino, SM. The Merit Award is bestowed to someone who distinguishes himself in his chosen field of endeavor in a manner that brings renown to Cathedral Latin School.

At Cathedral Latin, Joe was an excellent student graduating with a 90% grade average which placed him 5th in his graduating class of 271 students and making him a National Honor Society student. He was also active in many organizations at Latin including: Sodality (4 years); Homeroom Officer (4 years); Football (4 years); Track (2 years); Basketball (2 years). His years at Latin were busy but also memorable.

After graduating from Latin, Joe earned a BS in Mathematics from Case Institute of Technology in 1968 (where he also played 4 years on their football team) and an MS in Mathematics from Cleveland State University in 1970. He worked from 1969 through 2012 in Information Systems, highlighted by working 11 years as a Director with Cap Gemini Ernst and Young.

Joe was pleasantly surprised to learn of his Man of the Year selection. "Receiving the Merit Award from my high school is both humbling and deeply meaningful. When I look at the remarkable individuals who have received this honor before me, I am reminded that this recognition is not just about

personal achievement, but about service, loyalty and love for a community that shaped all of us Latin grads. Cathedral Latin played a defining role in molding me into the man I am today. To be included among them is something I never sought yet profoundly cherish."

In addition to Joe's successful business career, he and his wife, Patricia (Trish), were very active in their children's activities (they now have 15 grandchildren!). At St. Francis of Assisi Church, he served as a Eucharistic Minister and a Lector, coached CYO basketball, volleyball and softball, was a Cub Scout Troup Leader, and led the high school youth group. Joe was even known to be a driver for their daughters' Girl Scout trips. Joe has served as a cantor for 15 years and as a choir member for 17 years. He has also been actively involved in the parish food ministry for many years and regularly volunteers to work at the Diocesan Food and Clothing distribution center in East Cleveland. Over the past three years, Joe and Trish have partnered with Catholic Charities and Welcome Corps to sponsor refugee families.

Relative to Notre Dame-Cathedral Latin School (NDCL), Joe's leadership has been invaluable in building trust between our Alumni Association and the NDCL Administration and Board. In 2011, Joe joined the NDCL Board of Directors, serving the maximum term of ten years. During his tenure on the Board, and later as the CLAA President (8 years), he worked diligently to ensure that Cathedral Latin remained central to NDCL's mission, traditions, and initiatives. His efforts have strengthened the CLAA/NDCL partnership and expanded our alumni presence in the NDCL community.

Joe notes that the progress that's occurred has been due to the work of many. Yet he shared, "Perhaps my most memorable accomplishment was working with Sister Jacquelyn Gusdane and other CLAA trustees to get the Latin World War II Plaque installed at NDCL on the wall near their chapel. Getting this done was the main issue which brought me to the CLAA."

Some (certainly not all!) of those accomplishments include:

- Personally built a replica of the Cathedral Latin front door for the Portico at the W.O. Walker Center, where the Cathedral Latin Centennial Celebration was held
- Secured proper storage for Cathedral Latin artifacts in the archives room at NDCL
- Facilitated the installation of road signs (in Purple and Gold) for Latin Alumni Drive and Brother Nurthen Way on the NDCL campus near the football stadium
- Ensured that the Cathedral Latin "Mooney" statue of Mary and the Christ Child was placed in a prominent and respectful location on the NDCL campus
- Worked with NDCL and other Trustees to install a display of the cornerstone from the CLS building near the NDCL football field
- Worked with CLAA Trustees to provide ongoing support for the Brother Nurthen Fund
- Led an effort to purchase and install a plaque honoring Brother Francis Nurthen in a prominent location at NDCL
- Maintained the organization's mission of promoting camaraderie among alumni and supporting NDCL both financially and spiritually

Joe reflected on his commitment recently, "Cathedral Latin instilled in me values of leadership, integrity, faith and commitment that have guided me through my life. Serving as President of the Cathedral Latin Alumni Association for eight years, being a member of the CLAA Board of Trustees, and being on the NDCL Board of Directors for 10 years was never about titles or positions; it was about giving back to an institution that gave me so much. When Latin closed and then merged into NDCL, I felt a responsibility to help ensure that its spirit, traditions and legacy would continue to live on. This award represents not only my dedication, but my enduring gratitude for a school I will always love and carry with me in my heart."

Brother Tom Giardino, SM '60 2026 MERIT AWARD

Brother Tom Giardino's lifelong journey as a "Man of Latin" began early in his life. Born in Cleveland, he was the only child of loving Italian-American parents. Tom graduated from Gesu School in 1956. It was a Sister of Notre Dame at Gesu who suggested that Tom attend Cathedral Latin because of his interest in speech and debate.



Tom was sure that Latin was the school for him and jumped into his activities with vigor, beginning with track his freshman and sophomore years. He excelled in his studies, but also made friends, and had fun. He especially enjoyed the success that Latin's basketball and football teams had during his high school years.

Yet there was much more than athletics that was of interest to young Tom. By his junior year he joined the Sodality and began as a sportswriter for the *Latineer*, winning the top State award at the Kent State journalism conference in his senior year. The next year, Tom was elected Senior class president and was given the Most Active Senior Award. He was a member of the National Honor Society, graduated fifth in his class academically, and was Salutatorian of the graduating Class of 1960.

During a conversation with one of the Brothers, Tom discerned that Marianist life was for him. But his parents said no at that time, so Tom took the scholarship he was offered for the Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania. By Easter of his freshman year, his parents relented and he entered the Marianist novitiate.

He professed his first vows in the Society of Mary in 1962. Tom attained two undergraduate degrees from the University of Dayton in 1965, one in theology and the other in education. He also began his educational ministry that year, teaching religion and French at North Catholic High School in Pittsburgh. He subsequently earned a master's degree in sociology and one in religious studies. In 2022, Tom celebrated his 60th anniversary as a Marianist.

He has had a productive and successful career as an educator, writer, author, editor, leader, and more in his religious vocation. He authored two books with Latin alums and another on his own. From 1991-2001, he lived and worked out of Rome as International Director of Education on the SM General Administration. In this capacity, he led

the development and implementation of the *Characteristics of Marianist Education* that formed the framework for Marianist educational institutions thought and action at various levels in 30 plus countries. These documents were translated into 10 different languages. During this time, he regularly traveled to the 30 countries where the Marianists lived and worked, giving presentations in English, Spanish, French or Italian on education while meeting with students, faculty, administration, and staff of the 100 plus schools and universities sponsored by the Marianists.

Tom is presently working as an editor at the North American Center for Marianist Studies in Dayton, and as an Assistant for Special Projects at UD. He is a Trustee Emeritus of the University of Dayton (23 years on the Board), is presently on the Board of St. Mary's University (San Antonio, TX), and was previously on the Board of Regents for Chaminade University (Honolulu, HI).

Tom has previously served in other Marianist leadership roles, including:

- Executive Director of the Association of Marianist Universities
- Executive Director of International Center for Marianist Formation
- Director of Education for the Marianist Province of the USA and the former Cincinnati Province
- Senior Executive Editor of the Marianist Resources Commission

Brother Tom has also had a long relationship with our partners at Notre Dame-Cathedral Latin School. He participated in the opening of NDCL in 1988 with Bro. Frank Nurthen. In 2003, he assisted NDCL's Strategic Planning team with the drafting of the school's first Mission Statement. Tom was nominated for the Merit Award by another Cathedral Latin Man of the Year, Brother Joe Kamis, SM '65.

COOPERSTOWN MAKES THE “WRITE” CALL ON PAUL HOYNES

Paul Hoynes '69 to be inducted into National Baseball Hall of Fame this Summer



From Cleveland Heights to East 107th Street to Milwaukee.

Hoynes grew up in Cleveland Heights, one of 5 children to Jim and Billie Marie Hoynes. He attended St. Ann's Catholic School and parish and decided that Cathedral Latin School was the right place for high school.

“My dad worked downtown, so he'd drive me down Cedar Hill to Latin. He was an Ignatius guy then went to the Navy. All the guys I hung out with went to Latin and we hitchhiked home. You could do that back then.”

Hoynes got the writing itch during his time at Cathedral Latin. He credits a creative writing class taught by Brother Barry Trick, S.M. that inspired him to seek journalism as a career. Growing up he had a paper route for the *Cleveland Press* and read *The Plain Dealer's* Hal Lebovitz, Chuck Heaton and Dan Coughlin as well as Bob August in the *Cleveland Press* and *The News Herald*.

“I wasn't very good at sports,” Hoynes says. “But I loved sports. I thought ‘sports writing is something I can probably do as a career.’ There's nothing else I'd rather be doing. My mom encouraged me and I went for it. I know a lot of young kids don't know what it is they want to do and that's OK. I was fortunate at a young age to know what I wanted to do as a career.”

After high school, Paul enrolled at Marquette University in Milwaukee. He took journalism classes and wrote for the school newspaper. He also played rugby and wrote the rugby stories for the school.

“Milwaukee is a lot like Cleveland, cold and on the lake,” he says with a smile. “It's a downtown school that looks a lot different now than when I was there. Back then Al McGuire was the basketball coach and basketball was #1 in that city. I graduated in four years which shocked my father. I've stayed close with a lot of my Marquette friends.”

“I still don't really believe it” is what Paul Hoynes '69 says on a January afternoon over lunch. “It” is the December day that he found out from Jack O'Connell, president of the Baseball Writers Association of America, that he was selected for induction into the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, NY this summer. Hoynes has been the beat writer for the Cleveland Indians/Guardians for the *Plain Dealer* and *Cleveland.com* since 1985.



Salute to Chris Lynch '75

It is an impressive accomplishment that the Cathedral Latin Alumni Association marked its 75th Anniversary in 2025 — especially since the school has been closed since 1979. This remarkable feat has been accomplished due to the grace of God and the incredible drive of that good old Purple and Gold spirit! Most of the credit for this stems from the ongoing commitment of the CLAA Board of Trustees, founded back in 1950.



For over 75 years, our Latin alumni have celebrated the amazing story that is the legacy of our alma mater. The Trustees of the CLAA have been steadily leading the way, ensuring that we remain informed of alumni happenings, reporting on important school news, hosting activities for our alumni, and most importantly, keeping us all connected to each other in spirit.

Many Men of Latin have volunteered to serve the CLAA *in deed and truth*. However, it's not a stretch to say that no Trustee has served more diligently and purposefully in this century than Chris Lynch '75. For over 27 years, Chris has dutifully attended hundreds of CLAA related meetings, served on multiple committees, chaired the annual Golf Outing, and capably led the CLAA Board as its president for nine years. Chris has consistently been present for our alumni and our Association, always ready to lead by example and often with a smile.

For all the goodwill that Chris has shared with us, the CLAA Trustees salute him as he steps down from the Board of Trustees. He described his Board years as "very rewarding." Soon after being inducted into the CLAA Hall of Fame in 1997 for his football and track accomplishments, he joined the Board of Trustees in 1998. He initially set out to help the CLAA survive and improve to better serve our alumni. By 2000, Chris was elected as the secretary of the Association. On short notice in 2003, he stepped up to lead the Board when the current president resigned. The following year (2004), Chris was elected as president and led the way forward until 2012.

As with any organization, there were numerous opportunities and challenges that Chris helped our Association successfully navigate. Reflecting on the CLAA successes that he helped drive, Chris happily rattled off several examples: New alumni

database, launch of the CLAA website, restoring and placing the Mooney Statue of Mary and Jesus at NDCL, publishing *When the Lions Roared* and the *CLS History Book*, refurbishing and placing the WWII Memorial Plaque at NDCL, re-painting and installation of the Latin Roaring Lion in NDCL gymnasium, hosting the CLS Founding Centennial Celebration, enhancing the CL Portico (the Arch) at the W.O. Walker Center, and assisting with the association's most recent back office streamlining improvements. On the other hand, he pointed out the challenges the CLAA faces. "The obvious one is simply ageing. We're not getting any younger." That reality leads to the second point. "Motivating people to get involved and attend our events." The CLAA hosts three annual events – the Communion Breakfast, the Golf Outing and the Athletic Hall of Fame.

Along with many other Trustees, he has become a strong advocate for our relationship with Notre Dame-Cathedral Latin (NDCL). He is confident that our partnership will continue to be mutually beneficial for both the CLAA and NDCL. This bond keeps the legacy of Cathedral Latin School alive. Chris encourages our Latin alumni to continue to support NDCL and their events and visit the beautiful campus.

Chris and his wife, Kathy, are very proud of their four daughters — two of whom graduated from NDCL while Chris was president. Perhaps one of their grandchildren will become a Lion one day! Finally, Chris expresses his profound thanks to his fellow Trustees and our alumni. "It's been fun keeping the organization alive and moving forward!"

THE STORY of the School



Cathedral Latin School was founded by Right Reverend John P. Farrelly, deceased Bishop of Cleveland, in September, 1916, for the purpose of affording the Catholic boys of Cleveland, without direct tuition charge, the advantages of a modern high school education in which religious training is an integral part.

For the first two years of its existence the school was conducted in temporary quarters at 11105 Euclid Avenue. In September, 1918, classes were opened in the present building on East 107th Street just south of Euclid Avenue. The new building, designed by Mr. E. T. Graham, of Boston, represents an interesting adaption of the architecture of the Italian renaissance to modern school requirements. It is a fireproof building affording classroom accommodations for about six hundred students, with fully equipped chemical, physical, and biological laboratories, a spacious gymnasium and large auditorium and chapel.

The enrollment has increased very rapidly, from one hundred and forty-two in September, 1916, to seven hundred and fifty in September, 1922. The school is conducted directly under the auspices of the Bishop of Cleveland by a faculty composed of priests of the Diocese of Cleveland in the Classical Department and Brothers of the Society of Mary in the Scientific Department. Rev. E. A. Mooney is principal of the school, Rev. M. L. Moriarity, assistant principal in the Classical Department, and Brother P. A. Coyle, assistant principal in the Scientific Department.¹

The curriculum is laid out on the principle of elective courses rather than elective subjects. The classical course prepares for college work in letters and arts, while the scientific course gives the students the preliminary work required for the various engineering courses in technical colleges of high standing.² In both courses emphasis is laid

on those subjects which are of general cultural value and therefore constitute the essentials of a solid secondary education even for those who must discontinue their studies after the high school period.

The school authorities are firm believers in the importance of physical training and in the educational value of school athletics when conducted under close and sympathetic faculty supervision. The representative school teams in the various branches of sports, under the direction of Father Moriarity, Father Habig and Brother Albert as coaches, have overcome the handicap of small beginnings and have won for themselves a place in the sun in Cleveland High School athletics.

Cathedral Latin School besides being directly accredited to our Cleveland Schools of higher education, Case School of Applied Science, St. Ignatius College, and Western Reserve University, is officially rated by the Ohio State Department of Public Instruction as a first grade high school, and is a member of the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.
